


Generating SAP Scripts in Workbench Running Scripts

4.1.2.1 Excel Sample Data for SAP

When Workbench generates an Excel spreadsheet, there are some sample values that are automatically input into the fields. This sample data is whatever data you employed when you made the recording. An example is shown below:
